

# Electronic Receipt Timeline

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### NIH's Electronic Receipt Goal

By the end of May 2007, NIH plans to:

- Require electronic submission through Grants.gov for all NIH grant applications.
- Transition from the PHS 398 application form to SF424 family of forms data set.
  - SF424 Research and Research-Related (SF424 (R&R))
  - 2. SF424 Discretionary (of limited use for NIH)

# This is a huge transition for all of us!

 The simultaneous transition to electronic application submission and a new set of application forms is a huge initiative for NIH with an aggressive time table

#### It involves:

- Numerous funding mechanisms
- Tens of thousands of applications ranging widely in size and complexity
- The transition relies upon many pieces for its success:
  - Technical development of eRA and Grants.gov systems
  - Trans-agency resolution of policy and operational issues
  - Lots of communication, training and outreach
  - Acceptance of change by NIH staff
  - Acceptance of change by our research partners in the extramural community.



# We are already seeing the benefits of electronic submission

- Resulting efficiencies may allow NIH to shorten the cycle from application receipt to award
  - Shortened application to award cycle for AREA grants an early win!
- Electronic validations improve data quality
- Reductions of scanning, printing, and data-entry costs
- Grant image is clearer and in color
- Electronic submission enhances our repository of data that can be mined by knowledge management and other tools



# Why transition to SF424 family of forms?

- SF424 consolidates forms currently used by Federal grant-making agencies
  - Applicants can use standard forms regardless of the program or agency to which they are applying.
  - Reduces administrative burden on the Federal grants community.
- SF424 (R&R) is the government-wide data set for research grant applications



### Why transition? It's the law...

- Public Law (PL) 106-107
  - Federal Financial Assistance Management Improvement Act of 1999
    - Improve the effectiveness and performance of Federal financial assistance programs
    - Simplify Federal financial assistance application and reporting requirements
    - Improve the delivery of services to the public
- President's Management Agenda (2002)
  - "Agencies to allow applicants for Federal Grants to apply for, and ultimately manage, grant funds online through a common web site, simplifying grants management and eliminating redundancies . . ."



### Why now?

It's been a long time coming. It's time.

 OMB has set the following FY 2006 Goal for Agencies: Post 75% of Funding Opportunities in "Find" on Grants.gov "Apply"

 The PHS 398 OMB clearance expires in September, 2007



## NIH's Transition Strategy

- NIH will transition by individual research program/funding mechanism
- <u>ALL</u> applications in response to these announcements for transitioned mechanisms <u>will require</u> electronic submission through Grants.gov on the 424 family of forms
- Mechanisms not yet transitioned will continue to require submission on PHS 398 on paper or through service providers
- NIH will announce plan to transition mechanisms in NIH Guide for Grants and Contracts
- Funding Opportunity Announcements will be posted in Grants.gov "Apply", generally 2 months before the submission date.



# SF424 (R&R) Grant Application Package

- SF424 (R&R) includes the following set of standard components:
  - R&R Application/Cover Component
  - R&R Project/Performance Site Location(s)
     Component
  - R&R Other Project Information Component
  - R&R Senior/Key Person Component
  - R&R Budget Component
  - R&R Personal Data Component (NIH will not use)
  - R&R Sub-award Budget Attachment Component




# SF424 (R&R) Grant Application Package

- In addition to the standard components, the following "agency specific" components will be used by NIH as part of our application package:
  - PHS 398 Cover Letter File
  - PHS 398 Cover Page Supplement
  - PHS 398 Research Plan
  - PHS 398 Modular Budget
  - PHS 398 Checklist
- NIH requires additional data collection to accommodate the unique information required for review of its biomedical research portfolio.


#### **NIH Timeline:**

# What does this mean for the other HHS ODIVS who are using eRA?

- AHRQ will join NIH as we transition.
- SAMHSA, CDC, FDA, and HRSA are still working with us to integrate into our eRA systems.
  - Our goal is capitalize on opportunities to include the OPDIVs when possible given the current status of their integration.



# What is NIH doing to get ready for electronic receipt?

- A lot of planning and preparation!
  - Coordinating closely with Grants.gov
  - Technical development
  - Infrastructure planning
  - Coordination with service providers
  - Interagency forms development
  - Coordination of forms development with the Grants.gov forms factory
  - Application guide development
  - Planning for transitioning mechanisms and posting of funding announcements



# What is NIH doing to get ready for electronic receipt? (cont.)

- Increasing staffing for help desks
- Coordinating activities of help desks
- Providing Grants.gov with a Citrix "solution" for PC emulation for Macs. (see <a href="http://www.grants.gov/GrantsGov\_UST\_Grantee/!SSL!/WebHelp/MacSupportforPureEdge.pdf">http://www.grants.gov/GrantsGov\_UST\_Grantee/!SSL!/WebHelp/MacSupportforPureEdge.pdf</a> for info on PureEdge support for the Mac)
- Talking to other agencies for lessons learned
- Developing communication plans to manage the change both internally and externally.
- Lots of contingency planning!



### **Getting Started – Registration**

Grants.gov and eRA Commons registration is required

#### **Grants.gov Registration**

- One time only registration good for electronic submission to all Federal agencies
- Registration on Grants.gov required <u>only for institutions</u>
  - Detailed instructions at: <a href="http://grants.gov/GetStarted">http://grants.gov/GetStarted</a>

It is critical for institutions to begin this registration process at least 4 weeks before applications are due!



### **Getting Started – Registration**

Grants.gov and eRA Commons registration is required

#### eRA Commons Registration

- Allows NIH to receive applications electronically from Grants.gov and validate them against NIH business rules.
- Provides a way for NIH and registered users to communicate electronically after submission.
  - Both organizations and PIs need to register
  - One time only registration
  - Detailed instructions at:

Make sure you have an application to convert documents to .pdf format <a href="http://grants.gov/assets/PDFConversion.pdf">http://grants.gov/assets/PDFConversion.pdf</a>



## **Electronic Submission Options**

- Direct to Grants.gov using PureEdge Forms Viewer (downloaded from Grants.gov site)
- Establish an electronic system that allows the institution to submit to Grants.gov using system-to-system (XML) data stream
  - Can be created by institution OR
  - Institution can establish an agreement with a commercial service provider
